**ORDINANCE NO. 2026-07**

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE 2003-07, AND THE COMPENSATION FOR MAYOR OF THE CITY OF LONDON; SEVERABILITY, REPEALING PRIOR ORDINANCES AND EFFECTIVE DATE**

WHEREAS, KRS 83A.070 permits the City Council to set the compensation for elected officials, provided it is enacted not later than the first Monday in May, in the year the official is elected; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that is appropriate to revisit that compensation;

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF LONDON, KENTUCKY, AS FOLLOWS:**

**Section I**

Effective January 1, 2027, that the compensation for the Office of Mayor of the City of London is set as follows:

- (A) In the event that there is no City Administrator or City Administrative Officer for the City of London, which position must actually be authorized in the pay and compensation plan and filled, the Mayor's compensation shall be set at the rate of \$75,000 per annum; or
- (B) In the event that there is a City Administrator or City Administrative Officer for the City of London, which position is both authorized in the pay and compensation plan and filled, the Mayor's compensation shall be set at the rate of \$20,000 per annum;

**Section II**

This ordinance shall be effective upon publication, however, consistent with KRS 83A.070(1), changes in the rate of pay shall not take effect during a current term of office. Further, any ordinances in conflict with this ordinance be repealed to the extent of such conflict. If any section, sentence, clause, or phrase of this ordinance is held unconstitutional or otherwise invalid, such infirmity shall not effect the validity of the remaining ordinance.

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING A PORTION OF ORDINANCE 2025-15 RELATING TO  
RECORDING COUNCIL MEETING REQUIREMENTS**

**BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF LONDON, KENTUCKY AS FOLLOWS:**

**Section I**

Section IV of Ordinance 2025-15, relating to City Council meeting transparency is amended to read in full as follows:

- (A) All meetings conducted by City Council shall be live streamed on the City Website to include the following:
1. The videographer shall ensure that the camera view allows remote participants to see the entirety of the room to include the Mayor, City Council, audience, and public comment time clock and podium (at Regular Meetings).
  2. ~~[The volume for all audio will be set at the same level. All microphones will project the same level of volume.]~~ A good-faith effort shall be made for all participants to be heard at an approximately equal level, barring any external factors which are beyond the control of the sound engineer.
  3. The City shall procure a competent vendor to ensure that there is minimal disruption in live stream.

**Section II: Effective Date, Repealer, and Invalidity Provision**

This ordinance shall be effective upon publication. Further, any ordinances in conflict with this ordinance be repealed to the extent of such conflict. If any section, sentence, clause, or phrase of this ordinance is held unconstitutional or otherwise invalid, such infirmity shall not effect the validity of the remaining ordinance.
